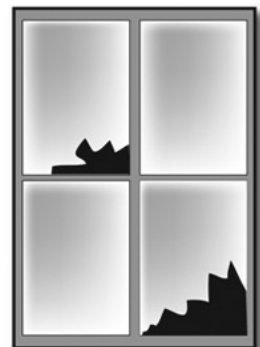
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- Use *whom* instead of *who* as the object of a preposition.
